COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 24, L.D. 57, Bill, "An Act To Exempt Occupants of Antique Autos from Seat Belt Requirements"

Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

'An Act To Exempt Occupants of Antique Autos from Seat Belt Requirements while Participating in Parades'

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 7 in the 3rd line (page 1, line 16 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "belt," and inserting the following: 'belt while participating in a parade. For purposes of this subsection, "parade" means an organized public procession, including, but not limited to, a march or a motorcade, that travels at a rate of speed of 10 miles per hour or less and interferes or has a tendency to interfere with the normal flow of vehicular traffic.'

SUMMARY

The bill exempts the driver and passengers of an antique auto registered pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 29-A, section 457 from having to wear seat belts.

This amendment exempts the driver and passengers of an antique auto from having to wear seat belts only when participating in a parade. This amendment is the minority report of the committee.
