14 15	§8869-A. Prior division approval for harvesting trees and authority to issue stop work orders				
16 17 18	The division shall establish a prior approval process for harvesting trees by a personal that has committed 2 violations of unlawful cutting of trees pursuant to Title 17, section 2510, subsection 1. The process must include at a minimum the following:				
19 20	1. Written approval. Requiring written approval from the division for the person that harvest trees on any land in the State; and				
21 22	2. Bonding. Requiring the person to post a private bond in an amount not less tha \$500,000 before commencing tree harvesting.				
23 24	The division shall issue a stop-work order if the requirements of this section are no met at the time harvesting is occurring.				
25 26	For the purposes of this section, "person" means an individual, corporation partnership, association or any other legal entity.				
27 28 29 30	The Commissioner of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry shall adopt rules to carry out the provisions of this section. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are major substantive rules as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375 subchapter 2-A.

The amendment requires the Division of Forestry to establish a process that applies to a 11 person that has committed 2 violations of unlawful cutting of trees. The process must 12 13 include requiring written approval from the division prior to harvesting, requiring 14 bonding in an amount not less than \$500,000 before harvesting and the division's issuing 15 a stop-work order if the requirements of prior approval and bonding are not met at the 16 time harvesting is occurring. The Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry is required to adopt major substantive rules to carry out the provisions of this legislation. 17 18 The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section.
