An Act To Allow a Junior Hunter To Take One Antlerless Deer without an Antlerless Deer Permit

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §11109, sub-§3, ¶A , as amended by PL 2009, c. 213, Pt. OO, §2, is further amended to read:
4 5 6 7 8	A. A resident junior hunting license, for a person 10 years of age or older and under 16 years of age, is \$7. Notwithstanding the permit fees established in subchapter 3, a resident junior hunting license includes all permits, stamps and other permissions needed to hunt at no additional cost. <u>A resident junior hunting license does not include an antlerless deer permit.</u>

11 12 13 14	 F. A nonresident junior hunting license, for a person 10 years of age or older and under 16 years of age, is \$34. <u>A nonresident junior hunting license does not include an antlerless deer permit.</u> Sec. 3. 12 MRSA §11152, sub-§8 is enacted to read:
15 16 17 18 19	8. Junior hunters taking antlerless deer. A person who holds a valid junior hunting license may take one antlerless deer without an antlerless deer permit in a wildlife management district for which antlerless deer permits are issued. A person who takes an anterless deer pursuant to this subsection must obtain a valid antlerless deer permit to hunt antlerless deer in subsequent years.

21 22 23	This bill allows the holder of a valid junior hunting license to take one antlerless deer without an antlerless deer permit. In subsequent years, that person must obtain an antlerless deer permit to take an antlerless deer.
