14	Amend the bill by inserting after the enacting clause the following:			
15 16	'Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §2001-A, sub-§2, as repealed and replaced by PL 2011, c. 691, Pt. A, §24, is amended to read:			
17 18	2. Exceptions. The provisions of this section concerning the carrying of concealed weapons do not apply to:			
19 20 21	A. A handgun carried by a person to whom a valid permit to carry a concealed handgun has been issued as provided in this chapter who is not otherwise prohibited from possessing a firearm;			
22	B. Disabling chemicals as described in Title 17-A, section 1002;			
23	C. Knives used to hunt, fish or trap as defined in Title 12, section 10001; or			
24 25 26	D. A handgun carried by a law enforcement officer, a corrections officer or a corrections supervisor as permitted in writing by the officer's or supervisor's employer;

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enter into reciprocity agreements with any other states that meet the requirements of this paragraph. Reciprocity may be granted to a permit to carry a concealed handgun issued from another state if: (1) The other state that issued the permit to carry a concealed handgun has substantially-equivalent or stricter requirements for the issuance of a permit to carry a concealed-handgun; and (2) The other state that issued the permit to carry a concealed handgun observes 8 the same rules of reciprocity regarding a person issued a permit to carry a 9 concealed handgun under this chapter; 10 G. A handgun carried by an authorized federal, state or local law enforcement officer in the performance of the officer's official duties;

H. A handgun carried by a qualified law enforcement officer pursuant to 18 United States Code, Section 926B. The qualified law enforcement officer must have in the law enforcement officer's possession photographic identification issued by the law enforcement agency by which the person is employed as a law enforcement officer; and

17 I. A handgun carried by a qualified retired law enforcement officer pursuant to 18 United States Code, Section 926C. The qualified retired law enforcement officer must 18 19 have in the retired law enforcement officer's possession:

20 (1) - Photographic identification issued by the law enforcement agency from 21 which the person retired from service as a law enforcement officer that indicates 22 that the person has, not less recently than one year before the date the person 23 carries the concealed handgun, been tested or otherwise found by that agency to 24 meet the standards established by that agency for training and qualification for an 25 active law enforcement officer to carry a handgun of the same type as the 26 concealed handgun; or

27 (2) Photographic identification issued by the law enforcement agency from 28 which-the-person retired from service as a law enforcement officer-and a 29 certification issued by the state in which the person resides that indicates that the 30 person has, not less recently than one year before the date the person carries the 31 concealed handgun, been tested or otherwise found by that state to meet the 32 standards established by that state for training and qualification for an active law 33 enforcement officer to carry a handgun of the same type as the concealed 34 handgun.

35 Sec. 2. 25 MRSA §2001-A, sub-§3 is enacted to read: 36 3. Reciprocity. The Chief of the State Police may enter into reciprocity agreements 37 with any other state to permit a person holding a valid Maine concealed handgun permit 38 to carry a concealed handgun in the other state.'

B-1. If a nonresident, has a valid concealed handgun permit from that person's state of residency. This paragraph does not apply to a nonresident whose state of residency does not require a permit to carry a concealed handgun;'

Amend the bill by inserting after section 7 the following:

'Sec. 8. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and allocations are made.

- 8 Licensing and Enforcement Public Safety 0712

9 Initiative: Eliminates 2 Office Associate II positions and one State Police Detective 10 position and related costs as a result of eliminating concealed handgun permits.

SUMMARY

20 This amendment is the minority report and allows a person who is not otherwise 21 prohibited from possessing a handgun to carry a concealed handgun without a permit. It also allows the Chief of the State Police to enter into reciprocity agreements with another 22 23 state to permit a person holding a Maine concealed handgun permit to carry a concealed 24 handgun in the other state. This amendment requires a nonresident to have a valid 25 concealed handgun permit in that person's state of residence before that person is eligible 26 for a Maine concealed handgun permit unless that person's state of residence does not 27 require a permit to carry a concealed handgun.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This amendment eliminates concealed handgun permits except in the case of issuance of a permit for reciprocity and would result in a reduction of Other Special Revenue Funds revenue to the Department of Public Safety and to the General Fund of \$237,180 and \$157,175, respectively, in fiscal year 2014-15. The bill includes the elimination of 2 Office Associate II positions, one State Police Detective and related costs with an Other Special Revenue Funds saving of \$250,436 in fiscal year 2014-15.
