HOUSE AMENDMENT "B" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "B" to S.P. 72,
L.D. 236, Bill, "An Act To Protect the Privacy of Citizens from Domestic Unmanned
Aerial Vehicle Use"

Amend the amendment in section 1 in §4502 in subsection 3 in the last 2 lines (page
2, lines 19 and 20 in amendment) by striking out the following: "for research and
development purposes" and inserting the following: 'as provided under section 4503,
subsection 3'

Amend the amendment in section 1 in §4503 by inserting after subsection 2 the
following:


3. Research, testing, training, manufacture. A manufacturer, subcontractor of a
manufacturer, testing company or educational institution may deploy an unmanned aerial
vehicle or any component parts for the purposes of research, testing, training or
manufacture of such vehicles.'

Amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter
or section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment adds to the list of allowed uses of unmanned aerial vehicles the
deployment of an unmanned aerial vehicle or any component parts by a manufacturer,
subcontractor of a manufacturer, testing company or educational institution for the
purposes of research, testing, training or manufacture of such vehicles, and exempts a
manufacturer or subcontractor, testing company or educational institution deploying an
unmanned aerial vehicle for such research, testing, training or manufacturing purposes
from the prohibition on the use of facial recognition technology or equipping a vehicle
with weapons.
