An Act Authorizing a General Fund Bond Issue To Fund the Dredging of Casco Bay and the Expansion of the Portland Fish Exchange

1 **Preamble.** Two thirds of both Houses of the Legislature deeming it necessary in 2 accordance with the Constitution of Maine, Article IX, Section 14 to authorize the 3 issuance of bonds on behalf of the State of Maine to provide funds as described in this 4 5 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 6 Sec. 1. Authorization of bonds. The Treasurer of State is authorized, under the 7 direction of the Governor, to issue bonds in the name and on behalf of the State in an 8 amount not exceeding \$6,500,000 for the purposes described in section 5 of this Act. The bonds are a pledge of the full faith and credit of the State. The bonds may not run for a 9 10 period longer than 10 years from the date of the original issue of the bonds. Sec. 2. Records of bonds issued; Treasurer of State. The Treasurer of State 11 shall ensure that an account of each bond is kept showing the number of the bond, the 12 name of the successful bidder to whom sold, the amount received for the bond, the date of 13 sale and the date when payable. 14 15 Sec. 3. Sale; how negotiated; proceeds appropriated. The Treasurer of State may negotiate the sale of the bonds by direction of the Governor, but no bond may be 16 loaned, pledged or hypothecated on behalf of the State. The proceeds of the sale of the 17 bonds, which must be held by the Treasurer of State and paid by the Treasurer of State 18 19 upon warrants drawn by the State Controller, are appropriated solely for the purposes set forth in this Act. Any unencumbered balances remaining at the completion of the project 20 21 in this Act lapse to the Office of the Treasurer of State to be used for the retirement of 22 general obligation bonds. 23 **Sec. 4. Interest and debt retirement.** The Treasurer of State shall pay interest 24 due or accruing on any bonds issued under this Act and all sums coming due for payment 25 of bonds at maturity. 26 Sec. 5. Disbursement of bond proceeds from General Fund bond issue. 27 The proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized under this Act must be expended as designated in the following schedule under the direction and supervision of the agencies 28 29 and entities set forth in this section. 30 TRANSPORTATION, DEPARTMENT 31 32 Provides funds for dredging Portland Harbor in Casco Bay. 33 34 Total \$5,000,000 35 36 MARINE RESOURCES, 37 **DEPARTMENT OF**

1	Provides funds for improvements to the Portland Fish Exchange building.
2	
3	Total \$1,500,000
4	Sec. 6. Contingent upon ratification of bond issue. Sections 1 to 5 do no
5 6	become effective unless the people of the State ratify the issuance of the bonds as ser forth in this Act.
7	Sec. 7. Appropriation balances at year-end. At the end of each fiscal year, al
8	unencumbered appropriation balances representing state money carry forward. Bond
9	proceeds that have not been expended within 10 years after the date of the sale of the
10 11	bonds lapse to the Office of the Treasurer of State to be used for the retirement of general obligation bonds.
12	Sec. 8. Bonds authorized but not issued. Any bonds authorized but not issued
13	within 5 years of ratification of this Act are deauthorized and may not be issued, excep
14 15	that the Legislature may, within 2 years after the expiration of that 5-year period, extend the period for issuing any remaining unissued bonds for an additional amount of time no
16	to exceed 5 years.
17	Sec. 9. Referendum for ratification; submission at election; form of
18	question; effective date. This Act must be submitted to the legal voters of the State a
19	a statewide election held in the month of November following passage of this Act. The
20	municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns
21 22	and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election to vote on the acceptance or rejection of this Act by voting on the following question:
23	"Do you favor a \$6,500,000 bond issue to provide for the dredging of
24 25	Portland Harbor in Casco Bay and for improvements to the Portland Fish Exchange building?"
26	The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question
27	and designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within a corresponding square
28	below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, counted and
29	declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of
30	State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall
31 32	review the returns. If a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of this Act, the Governor shall proclaim the result without delay and this Act becomes effective 30 days
33	after the date of the proclamation.
34	The Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all
35 36	ballots, returns and copies of this Act necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.

2	The funds provided by this bond issue, in the amount of \$6,500,000, will be used for
3	dredging Portland Harbor in Casco Bay and for improvements to the Portland Fish
4	Exchange building.
