1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §88, sub-§1, ¶A, as amended by PL 2007, c. 274, §18, is
 further amended to read:

4 A. The board has one member representing each region and 11 12 persons in 5 Of the additional persons, one is an emergency physician, one a addition. 6 representative of emergency medical dispatch providers, 2 representatives of the 7 public, one a representative of for-profit ambulance services, one an emergency 8 professional nurse, one a representative of nontransporting emergency medical 9 services, one a representative of hospitals, one a representative 2 representatives of a 10 statewide association of fire chiefs, one a municipal emergency medical services provider and one a representative of not-for-profit ambulance services. The members 11 that represent for-profit ambulance services, nontransporting emergency medical 12 services and not-for-profit ambulance services must be licensed emergency medical 13 14 services persons. One of the nonpublic members must be a volunteer emergency Appointments are for 3-year terms. 15 medical services provider. Members are 16 appointed by the Governor. The state medical director is an ex officio nonvoting member of the board. 17

- 20 D. A majority of the Six members appointed and currently serving constitutes 21 constitute a quorum for all purposes and no decision of the board may be made 22 without a quorum present. A majority vote of those present and voting is required for 23 board action, except that for purposes of either granting a waiver of any of its rules or 24 deciding to pursue the suspension or revocation of a license, the board may take 25 action only if the proposed waiver, suspension or revocation receives a favorable vote from at least 2/3 of the members present and voting and from no less than a majority 26 27 of the appointed and currently serving members. The board may use video conferencing and other technologies to conduct its business but is not exempt from 28 Title 1, chapter 13, subchapter 1. Members of the board, its subcommittees or its 29 30 staff may participate in a meeting of the board, subcommittees or staff via video 31 conferencing, conference telephone or similar communications equipment by means 32 of which all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other, and 33 participation in a meeting pursuant to this subsection constitutes presence in person at 34 such meeting.
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SUMMARY

This bill adds an additional representative of a statewide association of fire chiefs to the Emergency Medical Services' Board and clarifies that 6 members constitute a quorum of the board.
