An Act To Reduce the Licensing Fee for Certain Tournament Games

Sec. 1. 17 MRSA §1836, sub-§3-A, ¶A, as enacted by PL 2011, c. 325, §3, is
amended to read:

- A. For tournament games that do not exceed 100 players:
 - (1) One hundred fifty Fifty dollars per tournament license;
 - (2) Two hundred fifty Seventy-five dollars for a monthly license; and
 - (3) Three thousand Nine hundred dollars for an annual license; and

8 Sec. 2. 17 MRSA §1836, sub-§4, as amended by PL 2011, c. 325, §4, is further
9 amended to read:

10 4. Tournament. The organization licensed to conduct a tournament game under this section shall display the rules of the tournament game and the license issued. The 11 maximum number of players allowed is 100 unless the tournament game is held on 12 13 premises owned by the licensee, in which case the maximum number of players allowed 14 is 300. Winners are determined by a process of elimination. The use of currency is prohibited as part of tournament game play. The maximum entry fee to play in the 15 tournament game is \$100, except the organization may add to the player entry fee to 16 defray the cost of the license fee, as long as the total additional amount collected from all 17 players does not exceed \$125. An organization that holds a per tournament license may 18 19 collect up to \$150 to defray the cost of the license fee. Only one entry fee is permitted 20 per person. A tournament game must be completed within 48 hours. Other games of 21 chance on the premises are prohibited during a tournament game, except for lucky seven 22 or similar sealed tickets and no more than one 50/50 raffle per tournament with a prize value up to \$1,000. This subsection does not prohibit a licensee from conducting one 23 24 winner-take-all hand per tournament game with a bet limit of \$5. The total number of 25 bets received in a winner-take-all round must be awarded to the winner or in the case of multiple winners divided among them as evenly as possible. All prizes awarded in 26 27 accordance with this subsection must be paid in cash.

SUMMARY

This bill reduces the license fees for tournament games that do not exceed 100 players. This bill also eliminates the ability of an organization licensed to hold a tournament game to charge a player an addition to the entry fee to defray the cost of the license.
