2	Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §63 is enacted to read:
3	§63. Report of criminal activity
4 5 6 7 8 9	The administration of an institution supported by public funds that provides a public service shall immediately report or cause a report to be made to the appropriate law enforcement agency any knowledge or suspicion of a crime or criminal activity that is taking or has taken place on the grounds of the institution. A person who violates this section commits a civil violation for which a fine of not more than \$100 may be adjudged.

11 12 13 14	This bill requires the administration of an institution supported by public funds that provides a public service to immediately report to the appropriate law enforcement agency any knowledge or suspicion of a crime or criminal activity that is taking or has taken place on the grounds of the institution.
