An Act To Provide for the Continuity of a Veterinary Practice Subsequent to the Death or Incapacitation of the Owner

- 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- 2 Sec. 1. 13 MRSA §732, sub-§6 is enacted to read:

3 6. Legal guardian or personal representative of deceased or incapacitated veterinarian. For the purposes of this chapter, the legal guardian or personal 4 representative of a veterinarian licensed under Title 32, chapter 71-A may contract with 5 another veterinarian to continue the operations of the practice of the deceased or 6 incapacitated veterinarian for a period of up to 24 months after the death or incapacitation 7 of the veterinarian or until the practice is sold, whichever occurs first. For purposes of 8 9 this subsection, "personal representative" has the same meaning as in Title 18-A, section 10 1-201, subsection 30.

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## SUMMARY

Under current law, a veterinarian may practice only under the veterinarian's own name or in association with one or more other veterinarians. This bill permits the legal guardian or personal representative of a deceased or incapacitated veterinarian to contract with another veterinarian to continue the practice for a period of up to 24 months after the death or incapacitation of the veterinarian or until the practice is sold, whichever occurs first.
