Per-pupil allocation for students enrolled in virtual public charter 17 schools. Resolved: That the Department of Education, in consultation with the Maine 18 Charter School Commission, shall review the funding provisions established in the Maine 19 Revised Statutes, Title 20-A., section 2413 related to determining the per-pupil allocation 20 amount necessary for the costs of operating virtual public charter schools and validating 2.1 the appropriate amount of funding for operating costs that should be provided for students 22 enrolled in virtual public charter schools. The Commissioner of Education shall submit a 23 report, including findings and recommendations, on the review of the operating costs and 24 appropriate per-pupil funding amount for students enrolled in virtual public charter 25 schools to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs by January 26 10, 2014. The joint standing committee may report out a bill to the Second Regular 27 Session of the 126th Legislature.' 28 **SUMMARY** 29 This amendment, which is the minority report of the committee, strikes the bill and 30 replaces it with a resolve that directs the Department of Education, in consultation with 31 the Maine Charter School Commission, to review funding provisions related to 32 determining the per-pupil allocation amount necessary for the costs of operating virtual

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public charter schools and validating the appropriate amount of operating costs that

should be provided for students enrolled in virtual public charter schools and report the

results of its review to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs,

#### Fiscal Detail and Notes

The Department of Education and the Maine Charter School Commission may need to contract with an outside entity to conduct the required review in order to determine the appropriate amount of per-pupil allocation that should be provided for students enrolled in virtual charter schools. According to the Department of Education, outside resources may be needed because neither the department nor the commission has the capacity, in staff resources or expertise, to gather and analyze the data necessary to make the required recommendations. The cost to the department and its ability to absorb those costs without impacting other programs and services can not be determined at this time.
