COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 188, L.D. 495, Bill, "An Act Regarding the Law Pertaining to the Confidentiality of Enhanced 9-1-1 System Information and Records"

Amend the bill in section 2 in §2929 in subsection 7 in the blocked paragraph in the first line (page 3, line 25 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "Class E crime" and inserting the following: 'civil violation for which a fine of not more than \$500 may be adjudged'

SUMMARY

This amendment is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary. It changes the penalty for intentionally releasing confidential information from a Class E crime to a civil violation.
