Purchase. The State Librarian shall purchase at least 25 2 copies, and may
 purchase up to 200 copies, of every town history or other book concerning the history of
 this State that is published in Maine. He shall purchase, within these limits, the number of
 copies required to meet the distribution requirements of subsection 2.

2. Distribution. The State Librarian shall retain sufficient copies of each history
 purchased under subsection 1 for the use of the State Library. The remaining copies shall
 be distributed without charge to all school, state, institutional and public libraries that
 request a copy. The State Librarian shall regularly publish and circulate to all these
 libraries a list of the histories available for distribution.

15 3. Surplus. The State Librarian may sell copies of each history that are not 16 distributed under subsection 2. The State Librarian shall fix the price of sale at the retail 17 price of the history. The Maine State Museum may sell these copies through its museum sales program, except that the proceeds from the sale of these town histories may not be 18 19 used as required under section 89 A. All proceeds from the sales of these town histories 20 must be used to pay the costs of the distribution required under subsection 2, and any 21 proceeds beyond these costs must be used to meet the costs of purchase under subsection 22 1.

6 §121. Confidentiality of library records

Records maintained by any public municipal library, the Maine State Library, the
Law and Legislative Reference Library and libraries of the University of Maine System,
Maine Community College System and the Maine Maritime Academy that contain
information relating to the identity of a library patron relative to the patron's use of books
or other materials at the library are confidential. Those records may only be released with
the express written permission of the patron involved or as the result of a court order.

13 SUMMARY

This bill removes maintaining and providing a video tape library from the list of activities that the Department of Education must perform in its school library media section and adds to the list maintaining and providing an electronic library service and database library. It repeals the provision of law that authorizes the State Librarian to provide bookmobile service. It also repeals the provision of law that requires the State Librarian to make a gift of money or provide books to a municipality that is establishing a free library.

The bill decreases the amount of town histories or other books concerning the history of the State that the State Librarian must purchase from 25 copies to 2 copies. It repeals the provision that requires the State Librarian to distribute the histories to school, state, institutional and public libraries. It repeals the provision of law that allows the State Librarian to sell any surplus of the histories.

The bill also changes some of the responsibilities of managing the Maine State Library from the Commissioner of Education to the State Librarian.
