Scientific studies suggest that longer doses of antibiotics to treat Lyme disease are not helpful. There are some doctors who believe that longer doses of antibiotics may sometimes be helpful Some patients believe that they have benefited from extended treatments of antibiotics;
27 28 29	3. Antibiotics can be lifesaving medications but can have serious side effects, such as the development of drug-resistant organisms. A patient who contracts an infection from a drug-resistant organism may never fully recover; and
30 31	4. Information on treatment alternatives for treating Lyme disease is available through Internet search engines.'

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SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the minority report of the committee, replaces the bill. It requires the Department of Health and Human Services, Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention to include on its publicly accessible website information that informs users about the difficulty of diagnosing and treating Lyme disease, that scientific studies suggest longer doses of antibiotics are not helpful but that some doctors and patients believe they are helpful and beneficial, that antibiotic use can lead to the development of drug-resistant organisms and that information on treatment alternatives for Lyme disease is available through Internet search engines.
