1 C. A person who violates this subsection after having been adjudicated as having  
2 committed 3 or more civil violations under this Part within the previous 5-year period

4 3. Offer lead sinker or bare lead jig for sale. This subsection governs offering  
5 lead sinkers and bare lead jigs for sale.

6 A. A person may not:

7 (1) Offer for sale a lead sinker; or

8 (2) Beginning September 1, 2016, offer for sale a bare lead jig.

9 B. A person who violates this subsection commits a civil violation for which a fine  
10 of not less than \$100 nor more than \$500 may be adjudged.

11 C. A person who violates this subsection after having been adjudicated as having  
12 committed 3 or more civil violations under this Part within the previous 5-year period  
13 commits a Class E crime.

14 **Sec. 3. 12 MRSA §12664** is enacted to read:

15 **§12664. Unlawful use of lead sinkers and bare lead jigs**

16 **1. Definitions.** As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the  
17 following terms have the following meanings.

18 A. "Bare lead jig" means an unpainted lead jig that contains lead and that:

19 (1) Weighs one ounce or less; or

20 (2) Measures 2 1/2 inches or less in length.

21 B. "Lead sinker" means a device that contains lead that is designed to be attached to  
22 a fishing line and intended to sink the line and that:

23 (1) Weighs one ounce or less; or

24 (2) Measures 2 1/2 inches or less in length.

25 "Lead sinker" does not include artificial lures, weighted line, weighted flies or jig  
26 heads.

27 **2. Unlawful use.** This subsection governs the use of lead sinkers and bare lead jigs.

28 A. A person may not:

29 (1) Use a lead sinker; or

30 (2) Beginning September 1, 2017, use a bare lead jig.

31 B. A person who violates this subsection commits a civil violation for which a fine  
32 of not less than \$100 nor more than \$500 may be adjudged.

33 C. A person who violates this subsection after having been adjudicated as having  
34 committed 3 or more civil violations under this Part within the previous 5-year period  
35 commits a Class E crime.'
