An Act To Encourage Transparency in the Disclosing of the Ingredients in Vaccinations for Children

1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §1067 is enacted to read:

3 §1067. Immunization; disclosure of information

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A health care provider or clinic staff person shall, prior to immunizing a person under health care provider or clinic staff person shall, prior to immunizing a person under network to the parent or the guardian of the child. The health care provider or clinic staff person shall notify the parent or guardian that the parent or guardian has the option of refusing the immunization of the child based on religious or philosophical beliefs.

SUMMARY

10 The purpose of this bill is to provide greater transparency regarding the ingredients of 11 vaccinations and to reduce confusion related to school immunization requirements and a parent's right to decide against immunizing that parent's child. The bill requires a health 12 care provider or clinic staff person to, prior to immunizing a person under 18 years of 13 14 age, disclose the ingredients of the immunizing agent or agents to the parent or guardian of the child. It also requires the health care provider or clinic staff person to notify the 15 16 parent or guardian of the option of refusing immunization of the child based on religious or philosophical beliefs. 17
