COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 540, L.D. 789, Bill, "An Act To Lessen the Impact of High Feed and Fuel Costs on Maine Dairy Farmers"

Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

**'Resolve, To Establish the Task Force on Milk Tier Pricing'**

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the title and inserting the following:

**Sec. 1. Task force established. Resolved:** That the Task Force on Milk Tier Pricing, referred to in this resolve as "the task force," is established; and be it further

**Sec. 2. Task force membership. Resolved:** That the task force consists of 11 members, one of whom is the Executive Director of the Maine Milk Commission. The Executive Director of the Maine Milk Commission shall invite the following to participate as members of the task force:

1. The Executive Director of the Maine Dairy Industry Association;
2. One representative of a large milk processor;
3. One representative of a small milk processor, giving preference to an organic milk processor;
4. One representative of a Maine milk retailer;
5. One representative from each of the 4 milk pricing tiers;
6. One representative from the farm equipment industry; and
7. One representative from the grain industry; and be it further

**Sec. 3. Compensation. Resolved:** That members of the task force are not entitled to reimbursement for their expenses; and be it further

**Sec. 4. Convening of commission; chair. Resolved:** That all invitations to join the task force must be made to designated members no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the Maine Milk Commission

1 shall call and convene the first meeting of the task force, at which the members shall elect  
2 a chair from its members; and be it further

3 **Sec. 5. Staffing. Resolved:** That, within existing resources, the Department of  
4 Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry shall provide staffing to the task force; and be it  
5 further

6 **Sec. 6. Duties. Resolved:** That the task force shall study the current dairy  
7 stabilization tier program, established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 7, chapter 611,  
8 to determine if any modifications are necessary to ensure the effectiveness of the  
9 program; and be it further

10 **Sec. 7. Report. Resolved:** That, no later than December 4, 2013, the task force  
11 shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested  
12 legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry.  
13 The committee is authorized to report out a bill to the Second Regular Session of the  
14 126th Legislature based on the recommendations of the task force.'

15 **SUMMARY**

16 This amendment replaces the bill, which was a concept draft, with a resolve. It  
17 proposes to establish the 11-member Task Force on Milk Tier Pricing to study the current  
18 dairy stabilization tier program to determine if any modifications are necessary to ensure  
19 its effectiveness. The amendment requires the task force to report its findings and  
20 recommendations to the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and  
21 Forestry by December 4, 2013. The committee is authorized to report out a bill based on  
22 the task force's recommendations.
