COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "B" to H.P. 542, L.D. 791, Bill, "An Act To Increase Transparency and Improve Equity in Appeals to Superintendents' Agreements"

Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

'An Act To Improve Equity for Economically Disadvantaged Students Seeking To Transfer to an Approved Private School or a Public School'

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting the following:

'Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §15689, sub-§14 is enacted to read:

14. Adjustment for transfer of economically disadvantaged students. The commissioner may expend and disburse funds to reimburse an economically disadvantaged family for the tuition and transportation costs associated with a child in that family attending an approved private school or a public elementary or secondary school in a school administrative unit other than the one in which the child resides pursuant to section 5203, subsection 1 and section 5204, subsection 1. For purposes of this subsection, a family is considered economically disadvantaged if a child in that family meets the definition of economically disadvantaged student pursuant to section 15672, subsection 3.'

SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the minority report of the joint standing committee, strikes and replaces the bill to authorize the Commissioner of Education to reimburse families of economically disadvantaged students for tuition and transportation costs associated with attending approved private schools or public elementary or secondary schools in school administrative units other than those units in which those families reside.

Reimbursing certain families for tuition and transportation costs associated with attending an approved public or private elementary or secondary school in a school administrative unit other than the one in which they reside will increase the total cost of K-12 public education and the State's share of that cost. The impact to the State will depend on the number of families determined to be eligible for reimbursement and the actual tuition and transportation costs.
