Adjustment for transfer of economically disadvantaged students. The commissioner may expend and disburse funds to reimburse an economically 18 19 disadvantaged family for the tuition and transportation costs associated with a child in that family attending an approved private school or a public elementary or secondary 20 21 school in a school administrative unit other than the one in which the child resides pursuant to section 5203, subsection 1 and section 5204, subsection 1. For purposes of 22 23 this subsection, a family is considered economically disadvantaged if a child in that 24 family meets the definition of economically disadvantaged student pursuant to section 25 15672, subsection 3. 26 **SUMMARY** 27 This amendment, which is the minority report of the joint standing committee, strikes 28 and replaces the bill to authorize the Commissioner of Education to reimburse families of 29 economically disadvantaged students for tuition and transportation costs associated with 30 attending approved private schools or public elementary or secondary schools in school 31 administrative units other than those units in which those families reside. 32 FISCAL NOTE REQUIRED 33 (See attached)

## Fiscal Detail and Notes

Reimbursing certain families for tuition and transportation costs associated with attending an approved public or private elementary or secondary school in a school administrative unit other than the one in which they reside will increase the total cost of K-12 public education and the State's share of that cost. The impact to the State will depend on the number of families determined to be eligible for reimbursement and the actual tuition and transportation costs.
