An Act To Encourage Recycling

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

3	SUMMARY
4	This bill is a concept draft pursuant to Joint Rule 208.
5 6 7 8 9	This bill proposes to impose a fee of \$15 per ton on the disposal of solid waste as solid waste disposal facilities and solid waste processing facilities. The fee is also imposed on the movement of solid waste from one solid waste facility to another solid waste facility. Under the bill, no category of solid waste may be exempted from the fee and the fee must be paid to the State. Revenue from the fee must be distributed as follows.
11 12	1. The first priority must be given to providing grants to municipalities for costs related to the fee:
13 14	A. For recyclable materials, a municipality may receive grants equal to 1.3 times the fee paid by the municipality for disposal of the recyclable materials;
15 16	B. For all other materials, a municipality may receive grants equal to the fee paid by the municipality for disposal of the materials; and
17 18	C. The total grants awarded to municipalities may not exceed the total revenue collected from the \$15 per ton fee.
19 20 21 22 23	2. Revenue in excess of municipal grants must be distributed to school districts. The amount distributed to each school district must be computed by dividing the revenue from the fee in excess of grants to municipalities by the total number of students in prekindergarten to 12th grade in the State and multiplying the quotient by the number of students in the school district.
