**Resolve, To Establish the Commission To Study Accessibility and  
Affordability of Higher Education**

(EMERGENCY)

1           **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts and resolves of the Legislature do not  
2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

3           **Whereas,** the Commission To Study Accessibility and Affordability of Higher  
4 Education is established to study ways to improve higher education by making it more  
5 affordable and accessible to the State's citizens; and

6           **Whereas,** the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that  
7 the study may be completed and a report submitted in time for submission to the next  
8 legislative session; and

9           **Whereas,** in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within  
10 the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as  
11 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now,  
12 therefore, be it

13           **Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved:** That, notwithstanding Joint Rule  
14 353, the Commission To Study Accessibility and Affordability of Higher Education,  
15 referred to in this resolve as "the commission," is established; and be it further

16           **Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved:** That the commission consists of  
17 13 members appointed as follows:

18           1. Six members appointed by the President of the Senate as follows:

19           A. Two members of the Senate, including not more than one member from the party  
20 holding the largest number of seats in the Legislature;

21           B. One member who is currently attending an institution of higher education or who  
22 is a recent graduate of an institution of higher education;

23           C. One member who represents a family who has a student attending an institution of  
24 higher education;

25           D. One member who is a representative of a public institution of higher education;  
26 and

27           E. One member who represents an advocacy organization that represents students or  
28 consumer interests; and

29           2. Seven members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives as  
30 follows:

31           A. Three members of the House of Representatives, including not more than 2  
32 members from the party holding the largest number of seats in the Legislature;

33           B. One member who is currently attending an institution of higher education or who  
34 is a recent graduate of an institution of higher education;

35           C. One member who represents a family who has a student attending an institution of  
36 higher education;

1 D. One member who is a representative of a private institution of higher education;  
2 and

3 E. One member who is a representative of a financial institution in the State.

4 The commission also has the following ex officio members: the Chief Executive  
5 Officer of the Finance Authority of Maine; the Commissioner of Education, or the  
6 commissioner's designee; the Chair of the State Board of Education; and the  
7 Superintendent of Consumer Credit Protection within the Department of Professional and  
8 Financial Regulation; and be it further

9 **Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved:** That the first-named Senate member is the Senate  
10 chair and the first-named House of Representatives member is the House chair of the  
11 commission; and be it further

12 **Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of commission. Resolved:** That all  
13 appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this  
14 resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative  
15 Council once all appointments have been completed. After appointment of all members,  
16 the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission. If 30 days or more  
17 after the effective date of this resolve a majority of but not all appointments have been  
18 made, the chairs may request authority and the Legislative Council may grant authority  
19 for the commission to meet and conduct its business; and be it further

20 **Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved:** That the commission shall:

21 1. Undertake a comprehensive study of the administrative and academic decisions  
22 and practices at the institutions and system levels that affect accessibility and  
23 affordability of higher education;

24 2. Examine the effectiveness and financial sustainability of current financial  
25 assistance programs in the State;

26 3. Review the transparency and disclosure policies of institutions of higher education  
27 concerning financial aid awards, adjustments to those awards and total borrowing costs;

28 4. Review other states' efforts to improve accessibility and affordability of higher  
29 education and consider the best practices from other states, public institutions and  
30 systems of higher education in implementing the commission's plan;

31 5. Provide recommendations for implementing a strategic plan and specific actions  
32 that may be reasonably taken to increase the accessibility and enhance the affordability of  
33 public higher education for residents of the State;

34 6. Consult with all departments and agencies in the State to obtain advice and  
35 information as the commission determines necessary to facilitate its purposes; and

36 7. Have 5 meetings in 2013, with the first meeting on August 1, 2013; and be it
