2	Sec. 1. 24 MRSA §2908 is enacted to read:
3	§2908. Limited immunity for intranasal naloxone

A health care professional licensed under Title 32 is immune from civil and criminal liability and professional disciplinary action for prescribing, dispensing, purchasing, acquiring or possessing an intranasal naloxone kit or for administering naloxone intranasally to a person who is experiencing or is likely to experience an opiate-related drug overdose, if the health care professional acts in good faith and within the applicable scope of practice of that health care professional's profession. General immunity. A person is immune from civil and criminal liability for
12 13 14	purchasing, acquiring or possessing an intranasal naloxone kit or for administering naloxone intranasally to a person who is experiencing or is likely to experience an opiate-related drug overdose.

16 17 18	This bill provides immunity for health care professionals and other persons who assist a person who is experiencing or likely to experience an opiate-related drug overdose with intranasal naloxone.
