1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:		
2	Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §264 is enacted to read:		
3	<u>§264. Professional development</u>		
4 5 6 7	<b>1. Fund.</b> The Fund for Professional Development in Education, referred to in this section as "the fund," is established for the purpose of providing funding to school administrative units to cover a portion of the cost of professional development for teachers and other education professionals.		
8 9 10 11	2. Professional development opportunities. The commissioner shall establish a system to support school administrative units in the provision of up to 10 days per year of professional development for teachers and other education professionals. The system must:		
12 13 14	<u>A.</u> Include a process for school administrative units to request from the commissioner funding from the fund to cover the cost of professional development for teachers and other education professionals; and		
15 16	B. Provide that the commissioner shall approve funding from the fund to a school administrative unit that demonstrates that:		
17 18 19 20	(1) The professional development activities for which funding is requested will improve the ability of teachers and other education professionals in the school administrative unit to teach or provide other educational services for students in the school administrative unit's schools;		
21 22	(2) The school administrative unit will cover from local funds at least 50% of the cost of the professional development for which funding is requested; and		
23 24 25 26	(3) The school administrative unit has entered into an agreement with teachers and other education professionals in the school administrative unit regarding the purpose, dates, times and program components of the professional development activities for which funding is sought.

## SUMMARY

2 This bill establishes the Fund for Professional Development in Education with an 3 appropriation of \$2,000,000 to support up to 50% of the cost of up to an additional 10 4 days annually of professional development for teachers and other education professionals. The fund is administered by the Commissioner of Education, who must approve funding 5 6 if a school administrative unit demonstrates that the professional development for which funding is requested will improve teaching or educational services provided to students, 7 8 the school administrative unit will provide at least 50% of the funding and the school 9 administrative unit has entered into an agreement with the teachers regarding the timing 10 and components of the professional development activities.

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
