Aid to other law enforcement agencies 14 15 Except as otherwise provided by municipal charter or ordinance, the municipal officers may authorize the chief of police or other designee to request other municipalities 16 17 to provide police law enforcement officers to assist the requesting municipality. The county commissioners may authorize the sheriff or other designee to request a 18 19 municipality to provide law enforcement officers to assist the requesting county. The 20 municipal officers may authorize the chief of police or other designee to provide police 21 law enforcement officers to assist other municipalities or counties when so requested by a 22 properly authorized chief of police, sheriff or other designee of the requesting 23 municipality or county. 24 The authorizations of the municipal officers or county commissioners must be 25 accompanied by an agreement between the requesting municipality or county and the 26 responding municipality or county that specifies which municipality governmental entity is liable, if any liability is determined to exist, for personal injury or property damage 27 28 caused by or occurring to the police law enforcement officers of the responding 29 municipality or county in the course of assisting the requesting municipality or county. 30 If the request for assistance is for a major unplanned incident that jeopardizes the health and welfare of the citizens of the requesting municipality or county and when 31 32 delay may cause further jeopardy to life or property or in the case of jointly planned 33 collaborative activity, the police chief of any municipality or sheriff of any county or the 34 chiefs or sheriff's designee may request assistance from or provide assistance to another 35 municipality or law enforcement agency whether or not an agreement between the 2

municipalities or parties exists. Each police law enforcement department shall assume its

own liability to a 3rd party, except for liability incurred by the command or operational decisions made by the requesting department, which must be assumed by the requesting department. For the purposes of this paragraph, "major unplanned incident" means an extraordinary emergency to which a law enforcement agency is unable to adequately respond that presents a substantial and imminent danger to the public safety and that necessitates the cooperation or assistance of other law enforcement agencies.

The police <u>law enforcement</u> officers of the responding municipality <u>or county</u> or law enforcement agency have the same authority as <u>police law enforcement</u> officers within the limits of the requesting municipality <u>or county</u>, except as to the service of civil process, and, when assisting other municipalities, have the same privileges and immunities as when acting within their own jurisdiction.'

SUMMARY

This amendment adds to the bill to provide that county commissioners may authorize the sheriff or other designee to request that a municipality provide law enforcement officers to assist the requesting county and that municipal law enforcement officers may be authorized to assist a requesting county. The amendment also provides that the authorization from the county commissioners must be accompanied by an agreement between the requesting municipality or county and the responding municipality or county that specifies who is liable if any liability exists for personal injury or property damage caused by or occurring to the law enforcement officers. The amendment also provides that the sheriff or a sheriff's designee may request assistance from or provide assistance to a municipality or law enforcement agency whether or not an agreement between the 2 parties exists if the request is for assistance in a major unplanned incident that jeopardizes the health and welfare of the citizens of the requesting municipality or county.
