Sec. 5. 24-A MRSA §2765-A is enacted to read:

§2765-A. Coverage for services provided by dental hygiene therapist

- 1. Services provided by dental hygiene therapist. An insurer that issues individual dental insurance or health insurance that includes coverage for dental services shall provide coverage for dental services performed by a dental hygiene therapist licensed under Title 32, chapter 16, subchapter 3-C when those services are covered services under the contract and when they are within the lawful scope of practice of the dental hygiene therapist.
- 2. Limits; coinsurance; deductibles. A contract that provides coverage for the services required by this section may contain provisions for maximum benefits and coinsurance and reasonable limitations, deductibles and exclusions to the extent that these provisions are not inconsistent with the requirements of this section.
- 3. Coordination of benefits with dental insurance. If an enrollee eligible for coverage under this section is eligible for coverage under a dental insurance policy or contract and a health insurance policy or contract, the insurer providing dental insurance is the primary payer responsible for charges under subsection 1 and the insurer providing individual health insurance is the secondary payer.
- 4. Application. The requirements of this section apply to all policies, contracts and certificates executed, delivered, issued for delivery, continued or renewed in this State. For purposes of this section, all contracts are deemed to be renewed no later than the next yearly anniversary of the contract date.
 - Sec. 6. 24-A MRSA §2847-U is enacted to read:

§2847-U. Coverage for services provided by dental hygiene therapist

- 1. Services provided by dental hygiene therapist. An insurer that issues group dental insurance or health insurance that includes coverage for dental services shall provide coverage for dental services performed by a dental hygiene therapist licensed under Title 32, chapter 16, subchapter 3-C when those services are covered services under the contract and when they are within the lawful scope of practice of the dental hygiene therapist.
- 2. Limits; coinsurance; deductibles. A contract that provides coverage for the services required by this section may contain provisions for maximum benefits and coinsurance and reasonable limitations, deductibles and exclusions to the extent that these provisions are not inconsistent with the requirements of this section.
- 3. Coordination of benefits with dental insurance. Amend the bill in section 1 in §1094-BB in the first paragraph in the 4th line (page 2, line 2 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "licensure" the following: ', which may not exceed 3 years,'

Amend the bill in section 1 in §1094-CC in the first paragraph in the first line (page 2, line 7 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "Any" and inserting the following: 'Notwithstanding the requirements of Title 24-A, section 2752, any'

Amend the bill in section 1 in §1094-FF in the first paragraph in the first line (page 2, line 39 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "500" and inserting the following: '1,000'

Amend the bill in section 1 in §1094-HH by striking out all of subsections 6 and 7 (page 5, lines 2 to 7 in L.D.) and inserting the following:

- '6. Management of dental trauma and suturing; extractions. Conduct urgent management of dental trauma, perform suturing and extract primary teeth and perform nonsurgical extractions of periodontally diseased permanent teeth if authorized in advance by the supervising dentist;
- 7. Medications. Provide, dispense and administer, within the parameters of the written practice agreement entered into under section 1094-GG and with the authorization of the supervising dentist, anti-inflammatories, analgesics, antimicrobials, antibiotics and anticaries materials;'

Amend the bill by inserting after section 2 the following:

- 'Sec. 3. Exemption from review. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 24-A, section 2752, this Act is enacted without review and evaluation by the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, Bureau of Insurance.
- **Sec. 4.** Application. Those sections of this Act that enact the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 3174-WW; Title 24, section 2317-B, subsection 21; and Title 24-A, sections 2765-A and 2847-U apply to all policies, contracts and certificates executed, delivered, issued for delivery, continued or renewed on or after January 1, 2014 in this State. For purposes of this section, all contracts are deemed to be renewed no later than the next yearly anniversary of the contract date.'

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

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SUMMARY

This amendment is the majority report of the committee. It makes the following changes to the bill.

- 1. It amends the laws governing MaineCare coverage, health insurance contracts and group and blanket health insurance to provide for dental coverage and reimbursement for services performed by dental hygiene therapists authorized to practice under the provisions of the bill.
 - 2. It limits the time frame for a provisional dental hygiene therapy license to 3 years.
- 3. It increases the number of supervised clinical practice hours required in order to obtain a dental hygiene therapy license from 500 to 1,000.

- 4. It adds language to allow for the provisions regarding dental coverage and reimbursement to be enacted without review by the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, Bureau of Insurance.
- 5. It adds an application section to provide that the requirements of the bill relating to insurance reimbursement apply to all policies, contracts and certificates executed, delivered, issued for delivery, continued or renewed on or after January 1, 2014 in this State.
- 6. It makes changes to the sections of the bill relating to scope of practice of dental hygiene therapists by removing minor surgical care, replacing the authority to prescribe medication with authority to provide, dispense and administer certain medications within the parameters of the written practice agreement and adding the authority to perform nonsurgical extractions of diseased permanent teeth if authorized in advance by the supervising dentist.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

While the bill requires MaineCare reimburse for dental hygiene therapist services beginning October 1, 2014, any increase in MaineCare costs would not likely occur until the following biennium. The fiscal impact on MaineCare will ultimately depend on the timing and number of dental hygiene therapists licensed in Maine, the type and volume of services provided and the extent to which these services replace existing dental services provided.

The Board of Dental Examiners will incur additional costs to implement and administer a licensure process for dental hygiene therapists. However, these costs are not expected to be incurred until future biennia as it is anticipated that it will take several years before potential candidates become qualified to apply for and receive licensure. Additional costs to the Board of Dental Examiners, affiliated with the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, for the rulemaking process can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
