### An Act To Establish the Livestock Damage Compensation Fund

1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §3906-B, sub-§2-A** is enacted to read:

3 **2-A. Livestock Damage Compensation Fund.** There is established within the  
4 department the Livestock Damage Compensation Fund. This account does not lapse, but  
5 continues from year to year. The commissioner shall pay from the Livestock Damage  
6 Compensation Fund compensation to eligible farmers for loss of livestock to predation by  
7 coyotes and other wildlife.

8 **Sec. 2. Eligibility for livestock damage compensation.** No later than  
9 December 1, 2013, the Commissioner of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry shall  
10 adopt rules governing the use of the Livestock Damage Compensation Fund under the  
11 Maine Revised Statutes, Title 7, section 3906-B, subsection 2-A. The commissioner shall  
12 work with statewide associations representing farming interests to develop eligibility  
13 rules for farmers seeking compensation for livestock damage from the Livestock Damage  
14 Compensation Fund. In developing the eligibility rules, the commissioner may consider  
15 the applicant farmer’s adherence to best practices for housing and fencing to prevent  
16 livestock loss to predation, the presence of humane predator controls in place at the time  
17 of the livestock loss subject to the compensation request and the relationship of the  
18 compensation rate to a potential disincentive to the adequate protection of livestock  
19 against predation by wildlife.

20 **Sec. 3. Appropriations and allocations.** The following appropriations and  
21 allocations are made.

23 **Livestock Damage Compensation Fund**

24 Initiative: Appropriates funds for the Livestock Damage Compensation Fund to  
25 compensate farmers for livestock damage.

31 **SUMMARY**

32 This bill proposes to establish the Livestock Damage Compensation Fund as a  
33 nonlapsing fund within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry. The  
34 fund would compensate eligible farmers for damage done to livestock by coyotes and  
35 other wildlife. The bill requires the Commissioner of Agriculture, Conservation and  
36 Forestry to establish rules governing the Livestock Damage Compensation Fund no later  
37 than December 1, 2013.
