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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 472, L.D. 1353, Bill, "An Act To
10 Further Reduce Student Hunger"

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Amend the bill in section 1 in paragraph C in the 3rd blocked paragraph in the last 3
lines (page 2, lines 7 to 9 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "If a school
administrative unit chooses not to operate a federal summer food service program, it shall
notify parents of children in the school administrative unit of its decision and the reasons
for its decision."

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SUMMARY

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This amendment removes the requirement that if a school administrative unit chooses
not to operate a federal summer food service program, it must notify parents of children
in the school administrative unit of its decision and the reasons for its decision.

Required Activity

Requires the governing body of those local school administrative units that are required by this legislation to operate a federal summer food service program to provide notice of and conduct a public hearing before voting to determine whether or not to opt out of the program.

Insignificant statewide

The required local activities in this bill may represent a State mandate pursuant to the Constitution of Maine. Unless General Fund appropriations are provided to fund at least 90% of the additional costs or a Mandate Preamble is amended to the bill and two-thirds of the members of each House vote to exempt this mandate from the funding requirement, municipalities may not be required to implement these changes.
