SENATE AMENDMENT " A " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 975,
L.D. 1367, Bill, "An Act To Require Health Insurance Carriers and the MaineCare
Program To Cover the Cost of Transition Services To Bridge the Gap between High
School and Independence"

Amend the amendment by striking out everything after the title and before the
summary and inserting the following:

'Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

**'Resolve, To Improve Early Diagnosis, Treatment and Outcomes for Youth and
Young Adults with, or at Risk for, Serious Mental Health Conditions'**

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the title and before the summary and
inserting the following:

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not
become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, this legislation directs the Department of Health and Human Services to
apply for federal grant funding to provide services and supports to address serious mental
health conditions, co-occurring disorders and the risks for developing serious mental
health conditions among youth 16 to 26 years of age; and

Whereas, the immediate enactment of this legislation is necessary in order to meet
the timelines for grant applications established by the Federal Government; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within
the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as
immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now,
therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Federal grant funding. Resolved: That the Department of Health and
Human Services shall apply for, accept, receive and use as appropriate for and on behalf
of the State any grant money provided by the United States Department of Health and
Human Services, Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration under the
"Now is the Time" Healthy Transitions: Improving Life Trajectories for Youth and
Young Adults with, or at Risk for, Serious Mental Health Conditions grant program to

1 provide services and supports to address serious mental health conditions, co-occurring
2 disorders and the risks for developing serious mental health conditions among youth 16 to
3 26 years of age. For youth with existing mental health conditions, including those
4 experiencing early signs of serious mental illness, the grant funds must be used to
5 improve access to relevant child-serving or adult-serving systems and implement
6 effective evidence-based services and continuity of care to improve transitions to
7 adulthood and to improve outcomes. If any grant money is received pursuant this section,
8 the department shall ensure that the MaineCare program provides access to care
9 coordination and assertive community treatment services for eligible persons who are 26
10 years of age or younger who meet the criteria for a psychiatric diagnosis in the Diagnostic
11 and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, 5th edition, published by the American
12 Psychiatric Association and who experience significant impairment in function as
13 determined by a licensed mental health provider.

14 The department shall apply for grant money for which it is eligible as soon as
15 practicable, but not later than June 1, 2014.

16 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this
17 legislation takes effect when approved.'

18 **SUMMARY**

19 This amendment replaces Committee Amendment "A" and makes the bill a resolve.
20 The amendment requires the Department of Health and Human Services to apply for
21 federal grants that might be available from the United States Department of Health and
22 Human Services, Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration under the
23 "Now is the Time" Healthy Transitions: Improving Life Trajectories for Youth and
24 Young Adults with, or at Risk for, Serious Mental Health Conditions grant program to
25 provide services and supports to address serious mental health conditions, co-occurring
26 disorders and the risks for developing serious mental health conditions among youth 16 to
27 26 years of age. The amendment requires the department to apply for grant money no
28 later than June 1, 2014.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This fiscal note reflects the incremental impact of the amendment. The amendment replaces the bill with a resolve directing the Department of Health and Human Services to apply for an available federal grant to provide services and supports to address serious mental health conditions, co-occurring disorders and the risks for developing serious mental health conditions among youth and young adults 16 to 26 years of age. Any additional costs for the Department of Health and Human Services to apply for the grant are assumed to be minor and can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
