1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §1760, sub-§95** is enacted to read:

3 **95. Sales of certain adaptive equipment.** Sales to a person with a disability or to a
4 family member of a person with a disability of adaptive equipment for installation in or
5 on a motor vehicle to make that vehicle operable or accessible by a person with a
6 disability.

7 **SUMMARY**

8 Under current law, adaptive equipment installed on a motor vehicle owned by a
9 person with a disability to make the vehicle operable or accessible by a person with a
10 disability is exempt from the excise tax. This bill exempts from sales tax the sales of
11 adaptive equipment to a person with a disability or a family member of a person with a
12 disability for installation in or on a motor vehicle to make the vehicle accessible by a
13 person with a disability.
