Recreation Center and Transfer Authority to Cumberland County**

1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. P&SL 1971, c. 86**, as amended by P&SL 1991, c. 36, is repealed.

3 **Sec. 2. Transition provisions.** The following provisions govern the transition of
4 the Cumberland County Recreation Center to Cumberland County.

5 1. Cumberland County is the successor in every way to the powers, duties and
6 functions of the Cumberland County Recreation Center, referred to in this section as "the
7 district."

8 2. All existing rules, regulations and procedures of the district continue in effect
9 unless rescinded, revised or amended by the county commissioners of Cumberland
10 County.

11 3. All real and personal property, including records and equipment, belonging to the
12 district are transferred to Cumberland County.

13 4. All existing contracts, agreements and obligations under bonds or other debt
14 instruments continue in effect and the rights and obligations of the district become the
15 rights and obligations of Cumberland County.

16 5. Any employees of the district become employees of Cumberland County.

17 **SUMMARY**

18 Private and Special Law 1971, chapter 86 established the Cumberland County
19 Recreation Center to establish and operate the Cumberland County Civic Center. This
20 bill repeals the private and special law and transfers the rights and responsibilities to
21 Cumberland County.
