**An Act To Reduce Youth Smoking and Improve Public Health by  
Increasing Revenue from the Cigarette Tax to the Fund for a  
Healthy Maine and To Pay Debts Owed to Health Care Providers**

1           **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not  
2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

3           **Whereas,** this legislation needs to take effect before the expiration of the 90-day  
4 period in order to help prevent tobacco use by children and help smokers quit smoking;  
5 and

6           **Whereas,** in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within  
7 the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as  
8 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now,  
9 therefore,

10 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

11           **Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §4365-F,** as enacted by PL 2005, c. 457, Pt. AA, §3 and  
12 affected by §8, is repealed.

13           **Sec. 2. 36 MRSA §4365-G** is enacted to read:

14 **§4365-G. Application of cigarette tax rate increase effective July 1, 2013**

15           The following provisions apply to cigarettes held for resale on July 1, 2013.

16           **1. Stamped rate.** Cigarettes stamped at the rate of 100 mills per cigarette and held  
17 for resale after June 30, 2013 are subject to tax at the rate of 175 mills per cigarette.

18           **2. Liability.** A person possessing cigarettes for resale is liable for the difference  
19 between the tax rate of 175 mills per cigarette and the tax rate of 100 mills per cigarette in  
20 effect before July 1, 2013. Stamps indicating payment of the tax imposed by this section  
21 must be affixed to all packages of cigarettes held for resale as of July 1, 2013, except that  
22 cigarettes held in vending machines as of that date do not require that stamp.

23           **3. Vending machines.** Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, it is  
24 presumed that all cigarette vending machines are filled to capacity on July 1, 2013 and  
25 that the tax imposed by this section must be reported on that basis. A credit against this  
26 inventory tax must be allowed for cigarettes stamped at the rate of 175 mills per cigarette  
27 placed in vending machines before July 1, 2013.

28           **4. Payment.** Payment of the tax imposed by this section must be made to the  
29 assessor by September 1, 2013, accompanied by forms prescribed by the assessor.

30           **Sec. 3. 36 MRSA §4366-A, sub-§2, ¶D,** as amended by PL 2007, c. 438, §93, is  
31 further amended to read:

32           D. For stamps at the face value of ~~400~~ 175 mills, the discount rate is ~~4.15%~~ 0.75%.

33           **Sec. 4. 36 MRSA §4366-E** is enacted to read:

1 **§4366-E. Additional tax**

2 **1. Additional tax.** Beginning July 1, 2013, an additional tax is imposed on all  
3 cigarettes imported into this State or held in this State by any person for sale at the rate of  
4 75 mills for each cigarette. The tax imposed under this section must be added to the tax  
5 imposed under section 4365 and collected and administered in the same manner as the tax  
6 under that section. Payment of the tax is evidenced by the affixing of stamps to the  
7 packages containing the cigarettes.

8 **2. Transfers.** The State Controller shall make the following transfers from revenues  
9 received under this section.

10 A. The State Controller shall transfer to the Fund for a Healthy Maine \$20,382,200  
11 in fiscal year 2013-14 and \$19,832,200 in fiscal year 2014-15. In subsequent fiscal  
12 years, the State Controller shall transfer to the Fund for a Healthy Maine a percentage  
13 of revenue collected under this section that is equal to the percentage of revenue  
14 transferred under this paragraph in fiscal years 2013-14 and 2014-15.

15 B. The State Controller shall transfer the balance of revenue collected under this  
16 section after the transfer required under paragraph A to the Medical Care - Payments  
17 to Providers program in the Department of Health and Human Services to be used to  
18 retire amounts determined by the Commissioner of Health and Human Services to be  
19 owed to health care providers for services provided prior to December 1, 2012.  
20 When, as determined by the commissioner, there exist no outstanding amounts owed  
21 to health care providers for services provided prior to December 1, 2012, the State  
22 Controller shall transfer the balance of revenue to the General Fund.

23 **Sec. 5. Appropriations and allocations.** The following appropriations and  
24 allocations are made.

21 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this  
22 legislation takes effect July 1, 2013.

23 **SUMMARY**

24 This bill increases the cigarette tax by \$1.50 per package, from \$2.00 to \$3.50, to  
25 help deter the initial use of cigarettes by youth. It includes an appropriations and  
26 allocations section to fund certain programs through the Fund for a Healthy Maine and  
27 provides that any remaining funds must be used to retire debts owed to health care  
28 providers for services provided prior to December 1, 2012.
