A registered dispensary may not use a pesticide on marijuana except a pesticide that is exempt from the federal registration requirements pursuant to 7 United States 6 Code, Section 136w(b), is registered with the Department of Agriculture, 7 8 Conservation and Forestry, Board of Pesticides Control pursuant to Title 7, section 607 and is used consistent with best management practices approved by the 9 Commissioner of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry. A registered dispensary 10 may not in the cultivation of marijuana use a pesticide exempt from federal 11 registration requirements and registered with the Board of Pesticides Control unless 12 13 at least one registered dispensary employee involved in the application of the pesticide is certified pursuant to section 1471-D and all other registered dispensary 14 15 employees who have direct contact with treated plants have completed safety training 16 pursuant to 40 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 170.130. A registered dispensary employee who is not certified pursuant to section 1471-D and who is involved in the 17 application of the pesticide or handling of the pesticide or equipment must first 18 19 complete safety training described in 40 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 170.230.' 20 **SUMMARY** 21 This amendment, which is the majority report, strikes and replaces the bill but retains 22 the emergency provisions. It prohibits the use of a pesticide in the cultivation of medical 23 marijuana unless the pesticide is exempt from federal registration requirements and is 24 registered with the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Board of 25 Pesticides Control. The amendment requires that at least one applicator of an authorized 26

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pesticide must be certified by the board and all other employees of a registered dispensary or a registered primary caregiver who have direct contact with treated plants or who are involved in the handling of the pesticide must first complete the federal training requirements for agricultural workers or pesticide handlers.
