In the event of a temporary appointment under this section, the commission shall provide administrative support to the temporary commissioner and compensate the temporary commissioner for the hours spent at the commission working on a proceeding at an hourly rate that is computed by dividing the annual salary of commissioner, established in Title 2, section 6-A, subsection 2, by 2,080 hours.'

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This amendment changes the committee amendment's compensation structure for temporary commissioners. It limits a temporary commissioner's compensation to hours spent at the Public Utilities Commission (PUC) while working on a proceeding at a rate of a commissioner's yearly salary, currently \$115,328, divided by 2080 hours, resulting in an hourly rate of \$55.45 per hour. This may reduce the number of hours of compensation paid to temporary commissioners, resulting in incremental savings to the PUC compared to the committee amendment.
