12 Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the 13 emergency clause and inserting the following:

14 'Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §10257, sub-§1, as amended by PL 2011, c. 74, §1, is further 15 amended to read:

16 1. Fund established. The Lake and River Protection Fund, referred to in this section 17 as the "fund," is established within the department as a nonlapsing fund. The fund must 18 be administered by the commissioner. The fund is funded from fees collected for lake 19 and river protection stickers issued under section 13058, subsection 3 and from other 20 funds accepted for those purposes by the commissioner or allocated or appropriated by 21 the Legislature. Money in the fund may be used for enforcing laws pertaining to invasive 22 aquatic plants and nuisance species, inspecting watercraft for invasive aquatic plant and 23 nuisance species materials, educational and informational efforts targeted at invasive 24 aquatic plant and nuisance species prevention, eradication and management activities and 25 the production and distribution of lake and river protection stickers required under section 26 13058, subsection 3. For purposes of this section, "nuisance species" has the same 27 meaning as in Title 38, section 1861, subsection 2. The department shall annually by 28 January 15th provide a written report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature 29 having jurisdiction over inland fisheries and wildlife matters on the fund and activities 30 and accomplishments related to invasive species prevention and control that are 31 supported by the fund.

The Invasive Aquatic Plant and Nuisance Species Fund, referred to in this section as the "fund," is created within the department as a nonlapsing fund. The fund is

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1 administered by the commissioner. The fund is funded from fees collected for lake and 2 river protection stickers issued under Title 12, section 13058, subsection 3 and from other 3 funds accepted for those purposes by the commissioner or allocated or appropriated by 4 the Legislature. Money in the fund may be used only for costs related to conducting 5 inspections under section 1862, conducting invasive aquatic plant prevention, 6 containment, eradication and management activities and reimbursing agencies as 7 necessary for costs associated with conducting or enforcing the provisions of this chapter 8 and chapter 20-B. The commissioner may also use funds to contract with municipalities 9 or other entities to conduct inspection, prevention or eradication programs to protect the 10 inland waters of the State from invasive aquatic plant and nuisance species. The department shall annually by January 15th provide a written report to the joint standing 11 committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over inland fisheries and wildlife matters 12 on the fund and activities and accomplishments related to invasive species prevention and 13 14 control that are supported by the fund.'

SUMMARY

16 This amendment, which is the minority report, replaces the bill. It requires the 17 Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and the Department of Environmental 18 Protection to report annually on the Lake and River Protection Fund and the Invasive 19 Aquatic Plant and Nuisance Species Fund, respectively, and activities and 20 accomplishments related to invasive species prevention and control supported by the 21 funds, to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over inland 22 fisheries and wildlife matters.
