1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §13120-K, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 2001, c. 703, §6, is
amended to read:

4 2. Treasurer of State; annual financial report. The authority shall provide the 5 Treasurer of State, within 120 days after the close of its fiscal year, its annual financial report certified by an independent certified public accountant, who may be the accountant 6 or a member of the firm of accountants who regularly audits the books and accounts of 7 the authority, selected by the authority. The authority shall also provide the Treasurer of 8 9 State with an accounting of the authority's assets and liabilities at the end of its fiscal 10 year. The authority is also subject to the provisions of chapter 11. The authority may combine for accounting purposes any or all funds established for its programs and 11 activities. For any complete fiscal year that the authority contracts with the Finance 12 Authority of Maine, or any other state agency or quasi-state agency that is required to 13 submit to the Treasurer of State its own audited financial report, and the audited annual 14 financial report of that state agency or quasi-state agency includes for accounting 15 purposes the funds administered for the authority, the audited financial report of that state 16 17 agency or quasi-state agency satisfies the requirements of this subsection.

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SUMMARY

This bill allows the Maine Rural Development Authority to submit its annual audit as
part of its administering agency's annual audit.
