19 20 21 22 23 24	This amendment requires an employer that intends to relocate a call center to notify the Commissioner of Labor at least 60 days before the relocation. The bill requires this notice to be given at least 120 days before the relocation. The amendment reduces the fine for failure to give this notice from \$10,000 per day to \$350 per day. It also reduces from 5 years to 2 years the length of time an employer who relocates a call center to a foreign country is ineligible for a state grant, loan or tax benefit.

Lowering the amount of a fine that may be assessed on an employer who fails to make the required notification from \$10,000 to \$350 will reduce the amount of revenue that may be received by the General Fund.
