The chair serves for the duration of that member's term unless a majority of the membership elects another chair. At the end of the chair's term as member, the membership shall elect a succeeding chair by majority vote of the membership. Members serve for a term of 3 years. The group shall meet semiannually to conduct business and may meet and report at other times as needed. A quorum consists of 4 members. |
