COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 724, L.D. 1810, Bill, "An Act To Increase the Penalty for Failing To Carry Proof of Motor Vehicle Financial Responsibility"

Amend the bill in section 2 in subsection 6-A in the last line (page 1, line 13 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "severe" and inserting the following: 'serious'

SUMMARY

This amendment is the minority report and changes the phrase "severe bodily injury" to "serious bodily injury" to conform to the language used in the Maine Criminal Code.
