B. The criteria recommended by the working group to be used to determine areas to be closed to harvest or areas that are seasonally closed to harvest, and the scientific or legal reasoning for each criterion;

C. Based upon the criteria in paragraph B, the recommended process for designating areas closed to harvest or areas that are seasonally closed to harvest, disseminating those designations and revising those designations; and

D. To the extent possible, the recommendations of the working group in identifying areas closed to harvest or areas that are seasonally closed to harvest.

3. Legislation. The joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction
over marine resources matters is authorized to report out a bill to the First Regular
Session of the 127th Legislature that is related to the implementation of the plan update
submitted pursuant to this section. '

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SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the majority report and replaces section 2 of the bill, requires the Commissioner of Marine Resources to provide an update to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over marine resources matters by January 31, 2015, on the implementation of the Rockweed Fishery Management Plan.

18 The bill requires submission of a statewide management plan for rockweed and 19 contains specific parameters for convening a working group to develop criteria to be used 20 for designating areas closed to harvest or that are seasonally closed to harvest and to 21 propose specific areas for those designations. The amendment leaves the working group's 22 composition to the commissioner and clarifies that its purpose is to complete the work on 23 developing criteria for areas that are to be seasonally or permanently closed to harvest as 24 recommended by the Rockweed Fishery Management Plan and a process for maintaining 25 and adjusting those designations as necessary.

The amendment requires that the working group include scientists and experts with expertise relevant to this fishery and that each criterion adopted be supported by scientific or legal reasoning.

29 The amendment requires the update to identify:

30 1. The membership of the working group that is convened pursuant to the fisheries31 management plan;

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 32. The criteria and recommended process to define and designate areas closed to harvest or areas that are seasonally closed to harvest; and

34 3. The working group's progress in identifying areas closed to harvest or areas that35 are seasonally closed to harvest.

The amendment authorizes the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over marine resources matters to report out a bill related to the implementation of the Rockweed Fishery Management Plan.

The bill requires the Department of Marine Resources (DMR) to prepare and submit an update to the Legislature on implementation of the Rockweed Fishery Management Plan. The DMR must create a working group of experts to complete the work on developing criteria for certain areas closed to harvest or seasonally closed to harvest as recommended by the Rockweed Fishery Management Plan. Any additional costs to the DMR to undertake these activities are expected to be minor and can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
