#### **SUMMARY**

This amendment, which is the majority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Labor, Commerce, Research and Economic Development, eliminates the 10% sales tax on consumer fireworks proposed in the bill. The program established in the bill will receive dedicated funding from the State equivalent to 50% of the revenue received from the general sales tax currently imposed on the sale of consumer fireworks as set out in the bill, but the amendment limits this funding to 2 years.

This amendment adds an appropriations and allocations section to the bill.

The required local activities in this bill may represent a State mandate pursuant to the Constitution of Maine. Unless General Fund appropriations are provided to fund at least 90% of the additional costs or a Mandate Preamble is amended to the bill and two-thirds of the members of each House vote to exempt this mandate from the funding requirement, municipalities may not be required to implement these changes.

## Fiscal Detail and Notes

Dedicating 50% of the sales tax revenue collected from consumer fireworks sales to the Maine Length of Service Award Program requires transfers from the General Fund of \$109,250 in both fiscal years 2015-16 and 2016-17 and transfers from Municipal Revenue Sharing of \$5,750 in both fiscal years 2015-16 and 2016-17. The transfers will provide \$115,000 in both fiscal years to the Maine Length of Service Award Program. The bill includes Other Special Revenue Funds allocations of \$115,000 in both years.
