2	'Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §8842-A, sub-§1, ¶A, as enacted by PL 2003, c. 452, Pt. F, §40 and affected by Pt. X, §2, is amended to read:
4 5 6 7 8	A. Cut Christmas trees or evergreen boughs on land of another without securing written permission or a bill of sale from the owner or the owner's authorized agents and having a copy of this written permission or bill of sale in immediate possession. Only one such permit is needed per work crew. Violation of this paragraph is a Class E crime; or'
9	SUMMARY
.0 .1	This amendment clarifies that a person who cuts Christmas trees or evergreen boughs on land of another must have a copy of the landowner's written permission or bill of sale
2	in that person's immediate possession.

Requiring immediate possession of written permission to cut Christmas trees or evergreen boughs may increase the number of violations of a Class E crime.

The collection of additional fines may also increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.
