3	SUMMARY
4	This amendment replaces the bill. It provides that a nonresident student 18 years of
5	age or older and under 24 years of age enrolled as a full-time student in an institution of
6	higher education in this State is eligible for any hunting, fishing, trapping or combination
7	hunting and fishing license or permit at the resident fee and has the same privileges as a
8	resident holder of the license or permit. It also provides that the Commissioner of Inland
9	Fisheries and Wildlife and not the commissioner's agent may issue these licenses and that
10	each license must be stamped or otherwise identified as being issued to a nonresident
11	student. It also adds that a license issued is valid for one year.

### **Fiscal Note**

#### Fiscal Detail and Notes

Any additional revenue loss to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife from allowing certain nonresident students enrolled in an institution of higher education to be eligible for any hunting license, fishing license, trapping license, combination hunting and fishing license or permit at the resident fee is expected to be minor and can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
