An Act To Provide a Refund of Fuel Taxes to Maine Ambulance Companies

1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §2910-B, as enacted by PL 2005, c. 457, Pt. AAA, §3, is 3 amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read: 4 A company or association that has a contractual agreement with a political subdivision of this State to provide ambulance services must be reimbursed in the same 5 manner as is the political subdivision. 6 7 Sec. 2. 36 MRSA §2910-C is enacted to read: 8 §2910-C. Refund to ambulance services 9 A company or association located in this State that provides ambulance services to 10 residents of this State and that has paid a tax as provided by this chapter must be 11 reimbursed in the amount of the tax paid upon presenting to the State Tax Assessor a statement accompanied by the original invoices showing the purchases. Applications for 12 13 refunds must be filed with the assessor within 12 months from the date of purchase. 14 **SUMMARY** 15 Current law requires an agency or political subdivision of the State that buys and uses engine fuel to be refunded the tax paid on that fuel; this right to a refund may be assigned 16 17 to a person with whom that agency or political subdivision has a contract. This bill provides a fuel tax exemption to all ambulance service companies and associations in this 18 State, including those that have a contract with a political subdivision and those that do 19

not.
