4 5 6 7 8 9	2. Tips. The tips received by a service employee become the property of the employee and may not be shared with the employer. Tips that are automatically included in the customer's bill or that are charged to a credit card must be treated like tips given to the service employee. A tip that is charged to a credit card must be paid by the employer to the employee by the next regular payday and may not be held while the employer is awaiting reimbursement from a credit card company.

12 13	This bill eliminates the provision of law that allows an employer to pay an employee who receives tips less than the minimum wage.
