8 SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 286,  
9 L.D. 419, Bill, "An Act To Promote Academic Opportunities for Maine Youth during  
10 Summer Months"

11 Amend the amendment in section 1 in §8813 in subsection 1 in paragraph A in the  
12 3rd and 4th lines (page 2, lines 37 and 38 in amendment) by striking out the following:  
13 "No Child Left Behind Act of 2001" and inserting the following: 'Every Student Succeeds  
14 Act of 2015'

15 Amend the amendment in section 1 by striking out all of §8814 (page 3, lines 17 to  
16 43 and page 4, lines 1 to 6 in amendment) and inserting the following:

17 **§8814. Program fund grants; eligibility; calculation**

18 Beginning in fiscal year 2017-18 and each subsequent year, the department, through a  
19 grant application process, shall provide from the program fund funding to cover 90% of  
20 the costs of summer success programs in school administrative units with greater than  
21 50% student participation in the free and reduced-price lunch program pursuant to section  
22 6602, subsection 1, paragraph A. Any remaining available funds must be provided to  
23 school administrative units with greater than 35% student participation in the free and  
24 reduced-price lunch program.

25 **1. Eligibility.** To receive program fund money calculated pursuant to subsection 2, a  
26 school administrative unit must be in compliance with any applicable standards and  
27 program requirements for summer success programs established by the commissioner  
28 pursuant to section 8813.

29 **2. Program fund grants; calculation.** The commissioner shall calculate one  
30 amount of program fund money that may be made available as a grant to the elementary  
31 school level and another amount of program fund money that may be made available as a  
32 grant to the high school level in accordance with the following.

33 A. For fiscal year 2017-18, the commissioner shall establish a per-pupil amount for  
34 program fund grants.

35 B. For fiscal year 2018-19 and each subsequent year, the commissioner shall  
36 recalculate the per-pupil amount by using the amount calculated under paragraph A

1 as a base and adjusting for appropriate trends in the Consumer Price Index or other  
2 comparable index.

3 **3. Budget recommendation.** By December 15, 2016 and prior to December 15th of  
4 each subsequent year, the commissioner shall recommend to the Governor and to the  
5 Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of the Budget the funding  
6 levels for the program fund for payment in the next fiscal year. The commissioner shall  
7 include these funding levels in the department's request to the Legislature for  
8 appropriations from the General Fund, allocations from federal funds and authorizations  
9 of Other Special Revenue Funds and social impact bonds to carry out the purposes of this  
10 subchapter.

11 **4. Appropriations and allocations.** The commissioner shall provide funds  
12 authorized by the Legislature to carry out the purposes of this subchapter as grants to  
13 eligible school administrative units.'

14 Amend the amendment in section 1 in §8815 in the first paragraph in the first line  
15 (page 4, line 8 in amendment) by striking out the following: "2017" and inserting the  
16 following: '2018'

17 Amend the amendment in section 2 in subsection 5 in the first line (page 4, line 21 in  
18 amendment) by striking out the following: "2016-17" and inserting the following: '2017-  
19 18'

20 Amend the amendment in section 4 in the 2nd line (page 4, line 36 in amendment) by  
21 striking out the following: "2015" and inserting the following: '2016'

22 Amend the amendment in section 4 in the last line (page 4, line 39 in amendment) by  
23 striking out the following: "2016-2017" and inserting the following: '2017-2018'

24 Amend the amendment by striking out all of section 5 and inserting the following:

25 **'Sec. 5. Appropriations and allocations.** The following appropriations and  
26 allocations are made.

#### Fiscal Detail and Notes

This amendment delays the start date and eliminates the General Fund appropriation of \$76,729 in fiscal year 2015-16 and reduces the General Fund appropriation by \$6,612 in fiscal year 2016-17. This amendment also eliminates the Other Special Revenue Funds allocation of \$500 in fiscal year 2015-16.

As amended, this bill includes a General Fund appropriation of \$92,782 in fiscal year 2016-17 to a newly established Summer Success Program within the Department of Education for one Education Specialist III position and related all other costs effective August 1, 2017 to implement and administer the Maine Summer Success Program.
