16 17	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do n become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and		
18 19 20	Whereas, the Municipal Volunteer Working Group established in this resolve wi make important recommendations regarding ways to recruit, train and retain essential volunteer firefighters and emergency medical services personnel; and		
21 22 23	Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order the study may be completed and a report produced in time for submission to the ne legislative session; and		
24 25 26 27	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency with the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; not therefore, be it		
28 29 30	Sec. 1. Municipal Volunteer Working Group established. Resolved: The Municipal Volunteer Working Group, referred to in this resolve as "the working group," is established; and be it further		
31 32	Sec. 2. Working group membership. Resolved: That the working group consists of 9 members appointed as follows:

- 1. Two members of the Senate, appointed by the President of the Senate, one from the party with the greatest number of members and one from the party with the 2nd greatest number of members;
- 2. Three members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House, at least one of whom is from the party with the greatest number of members and at least one of whom is from the party with the 2nd greatest number of members;
- 3. One representative from the Maine State Federation of Firefighters, appointed by the President of the Senate;
- 4. One volunteer firefighter or emergency responder who may be active or nonactive, appointed by the Speaker of the House;
- 5. One chief of a volunteer fire department, appointed by the President of the Senate; and
- 6. One representative from the Maine Fire Chiefs' Association, appointed by the Speaker of the House; and be it further
- Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first-named Senate member is the Senate chair and the first-named House of Representatives member is the House chair of the working group; and be it further
- Sec. 4. Appointments; convening of working group. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council once all appointments have been completed. After appointment of all members, the chairs shall call and convene the first meeting of the working group. If 30 days or more after the effective date of this resolve a majority of but not all appointments have been made, the chairs may request authority and the Legislative Council may grant authority for the working group to meet and conduct its business; and be it further
- Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the working group shall find solutions to the recruitment, training and retention problems facing volunteer fire departments and volunteer emergency medical services providers in Maine.

The working group shall solicit input from municipalities with volunteer fire departments and volunteer emergency medical services, volunteer firefighters and volunteer emergency medical services providers and members of the public. The working group shall identify the reasons for recruitment, training and retention problems and recommend solutions; and be it further

- Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the Legislative Council shall provide necessary staffing services to the working group; and be it further
- **Sec. 7. Report. Resolved:** That, no later than December 2, 2015, the working group shall submit a report that includes its findings and recommendations, including suggested legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety. The committee may submit legislation related to the report to the Second Regular Session of the 127th Legislature.

Legislative Cost/Study

The general operating expenses of this study are projected to be \$2,250 in fiscal year 2015-16. The Legislature's proposed budget includes \$10,000 in fiscal year 2015-16 for legislative studies. Whether this amount is sufficient to fund all studies will depend on the number of studies authorized by the Legislative Council and the Legislature. The additional costs of providing staffing assistance to the study during the interim can be absorbed utilizing existing budgeted staff resources. If more than 4 meetings are held during the interim the estimated cost for each additional meeting is projected to be \$500 per meeting for legislative per diem and expenses.
