An Act To Remove the Philosophical Exemption from the Immunization Requirements for School Students and Employees of Nursery Schools and Health Care Facilities

1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 **Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §6355, sub-§3,** as amended by PL 2001, c. 326, §2, is 3 further amended to read: 4 3. Religious exemption. The parent states in writing a sincere religious belief that is 5 contrary to the immunization requirement of this subchapter or an opposition to the immunization for philosophical reasons. 6 7 Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §6359, sub-§3, ¶B, as amended by PL 2001, c. 326, §6, is 8 further amended to read: 9 B. The student or the parent, if the student is a minor, states in writing a sincere religious belief, which is contrary to the immunization requirement of this subchapter 10 11 or an opposition to the immunization for philosophical reasons. 12 **Sec. 3. 22 MRSA §802, sub-§4-B, ¶B,** as enacted by PL 2001, c. 185, §2, is 13 amended to read: 14 B. A religious or philosophical exemption is available to an employee who states in 15 writing a sincere religious or philosophical belief that is contrary to the immunization requirement of this subchapter. 16 17 Sec. 4. 22 MRSA §8402, sub-§3, ¶A, as amended by PL 2001, c. 645, §10, is further amended to read: 18 19 A. The department shall adopt rules regarding the health of staff as required to 20 protect the health and safety of the children. The rules must include a requirement that every 2 years each licensee, administrator or other staff member of the nursery 21 school who provides care for children be declared free from communicable disease 22 23 by a licensed physician, except that this requirement may be waived for a person who 24 objects on the grounds of sincerely held religious or philosophical belief. Rules 25 adopted pursuant to this paragraph are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter H-A 2-A. 26 27 Sec. 5. Rules. The Department of Health and Human Services shall amend its rules 28 to remove any rules exempting persons from immunization requirements because of their 29 philosophical beliefs. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules 30 pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A. 31 **SUMMARY** 32 Current law allows exemptions because of a person's philosophical beliefs from 33

immunization requirements for students in elementary and secondary schools and postsecondary schools and employees of nursery schools and health care facilities. This bill removes those exemptions. The bill also directs the Department of Health and Human Services to remove any immunization exemptions because of philosophical beliefs from its rules.

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
