1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §11401-A is enacted to read:
3	§11401-A. Opening day antlerless deer; youth, seniors and veterans
4 5	A person who possesses a valid junior hunting license, a person who is 65 years of age or older who possesses a valid hunting license or a veteran who possesses a valid
6 7	hunting license may take an antlerless deer with a firearm on the first day of the regular deer hunting season established in section 11401. A person who takes an antlerless deer
8 9	pursuant to this section must pay a registration fee of \$10 at the time that person registers the antlerless deer. A person who is 65 years of age or older and a veteran may not take
10 11	more than one antlerless deer pursuant to this section. For purposes of this section, "veteran" means a person who served in the United
12	States Armed Forces and was not dishonorably discharged.
13	SUMMARY
14 15 16	This bill allows a licensed junior hunter, veteran or person who is 65 years of age or older to take an antlerless deer with a firearm on the first day of the regular deer hunting season and imposes a \$10 deer registration fee.
