13	Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:
14 15 16	'An Act To Require the Department of Health and Human Services To Update Its Rules Governing Services for Children with Cognitive Impairments and Functional Limitations'
17	Amend the bill by striking out all of section 1 and inserting the following:
18	'Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3174-YY is enacted to read:
19 20	§3174-YY. Coverage of rehabilitative and community support services for children with cognitive impairments and functional limitations
21	1. Ongoing working group. The department shall establish an ongoing working
22	group to evaluate research on treatments for children with cognitive impairments and
23	functional limitations to determine treatments that can be considered evidence-based and
24	may be eligible for MaineCare reimbursement and submit those recommendations to the
25 26	commissioner for consideration. By January 15th of each odd-numbered year, beginning in 2017, the working group shall submit a report to the joint standing committee of the
27	Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters that outlines the
28	working group's findings, current levels of evidence for treatments and any actions that
29	have been taken by the department based on the working group's recommendations. The
30	ongoing working group consists of department staff, providers of services to children
31	with cognitive impairments and functional limitations, family members of children who
32	receive services and advocates for children. The working group shall identify treatments
33	that integrate the best available research with clinical expertise in the context of patient
34	characteristics, culture and preference. The department shall adopt rules to develop the
35	ongoing working group. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules
36	as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

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1	2. Publication of available treatments. The department shall publish the reports of
2	the ongoing working group established pursuant to subsection 1 and a list of evidence-
3	based treatments for children with cognitive impairments and functional limitations that
4	are reimbursed by MaineCare and update the list whenever a new reimbursable treatment
5	<u>is available.'</u>
6	SUMMARY
7	This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, establishes an
8	ongoing working group to evaluate research on treatments for children with cognitive
9	impairments and functional limitations to determine treatments that are evidence-based
10	and that may be eligible for MaineCare and to submit recommendations to the
11	Commissioner of Health and Human Services. The working group shall submit a report
12	on findings, current level of evidence and actions taken by the Department of Health and
13	Human Services to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction
14	over health and human services matters by January 15th of each odd-numbered year. It
15	adds a requirement for the Department of Health and Human Services to publish a list of
16	evidence-based treatments for children with cognitive impairments and functional
17	limitations that are reimbursed by MaineCare. The amendment retains the rule-making
18	requirement in the bill.
