1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §341** is enacted to read:

3 **§341. Common primary ballot**

4 The names of all candidates for Governor, United States Senator and Representative
5 to Congress, including candidates enrolled in a party and unenrolled candidates, must
6 appear on the same primary ballot. Notwithstanding sections 111, 144 and 340, all
7 voters, regardless of enrollment status, vote using identical ballots for candidates for these
8 offices. Only the names of the 2 candidates who receive the most votes at the primary
9 election for these offices may appear on the ballot for the general election.

10 **SUMMARY**

11 This bill provides that the names of all candidates for Governor, United States
12 Senator and Representative to Congress, including candidates enrolled in a party and
13 unenrolled candidates, must appear on the same primary ballot. All voters, regardless of
14 enrollment status, vote using identical ballots for candidates for these offices. Only the
15 names of the 2 candidates who receive the most votes at the primary election for these
16 offices appear on the ballot for the general election.
